

**CHEST PAIN**

<b>Acute MI</b>	Chest pressure, radiates, dyspnea, nausea, diaphoresis, CVD risk factors	GEN: Pallor, diaphoresis CVS: Murmur, peripheral edema
<b>Aortic dissection</b>	Tearing pain, radiates, dyspnea, paresthesia, CVD risk factors	CVS: ↑BP, asymmetric BP, murmur PVS: Limb ischemia, asymmetric pulses
<b>Esophageal rupture</b>	Hx prolonged vomiting, Hx instrumentation	GEN: Diaphoresis, subcut emphysema CVS: Crunching heart sound
<b>Pericarditis</b>	Sharp pleuritic pain, radiates, worse supine, recent infection, recent MI	GEN: ↓BP, tachycardia, fever CVS: ↑JVP, ↓S1/S2, pulsus paradoxus, rub
<b>Pneumothorax</b>	Dyspnea, sharp pleuritic pain, Hx trauma, Hx instrumentation	GEN: Tachypnea, subcut emphysema RESP: ↓A/E, ↑percussion
<b>Pulmonary embolism</b>	Dyspnea, pleuritic pain, hemoptysis, surgery, immobility, smoker, BCP, cancer, Hx DVT/PE	GEN: Tachypnea, tachycardia PVS: Leg edema, erythema, heat, tenderness
<b>Tamponade</b>	Sharp pleuritic pain, dyspnea, orthopnea, Hx trauma	GEN: ↓BP, tachycardia, pallor, diaphoresis CVS: ↑JVP, ↓S1/S2, pulsus paradoxus

**DYSPNEA**

<b>Acute MI</b>	Chest pressure, radiates, dyspnea, nausea, diaphoresis, CVD risk factors	GEN: Pallor, diaphoresis CVS: Murmur, peripheral edema
<b>Anaphylaxis</b>	Known allergen, dyspnea, wheeze, chest tightness, cough, rash, pruritis, NVD	GEN: ↓BP, resp distress, urticaria, erythema RESP: Wheeze, stridor
<b>Aortic dissection</b>	Tearing pain, radiates, dyspnea, paresthesia, CVD risk factors	CVS: ↑BP, asymmetric BP, murmur PVS: Limb ischemia, asymmetric pulses
<b>Asthma, COPD</b>	Known irritant, dyspnea, wheeze, chest tightness, cough, sputum	GEN: Respiratory distress, cyanosis RESP: Wheeze, silent chest
<b>Heart failure</b>	Dyspnea, orthopnea, cough, weight gain, CVD risk factors	CVS: ↑JVP, S3/S4, peripheral edema RESP: Wheeze, crackles
<b>Pneumonia</b>	Dyspnea, fever, cough, sputum, NVD, Hx travel, Hx sick contacts	GEN: Fever RESP: Wheeze, ↓percuss, ↓A/E, ↑fremitus
<b>Pneumothorax</b>	Dyspnea, sharp pleuritic pain, Hx trauma, Hx instrumentation	GEN: Tachypnea, subcut emphysema RESP: ↓A/E, ↑percussion
<b>Pulmonary embolism</b>	Dyspnea, pleuritic pain, hemoptysis, surgery, immobility, smoker, BCP, cancer, Hx DVT/PE	GEN: Tachypnea, tachycardia PVS: Leg edema, erythema, heat, tenderness
<b>Tamponade</b>	Sharp pleuritic pain, dyspnea, orthopnea, Hx trauma	GEN: ↓BP, tachycardia, pallor, diaphoresis CVS: ↑JVP, ↓S1/S2, pulsus paradoxus

**BACK PAIN**

<b>Acute MI</b>	Chest pressure, radiates, dyspnea, nausea, diaphoresis, CVD risk factors	GEN: Pallor, diaphoresis CVS: Murmur, peripheral edema
<b>Cord injury, Cauda equina</b>	Hx trauma, weakness, paresthesia, loss of bowel/bladder control	NEURO: ↓BP, focal deficits, saddle anaesthesia, ↓rectal tone
<b>Ectopic pregnancy</b>	Crampy pain, sexual Hx, LMP, vaginal bleeding, Hx tubal abnormality	ABDO: Tender, rebound, cough/bump sign GYN: Adnexal mass
<b>Osteomyelitis, Epidural abscess</b>	Fever, weakness, paresthesia, Hx IVDU, Hx instrumentation	MSK: Erythema, tenderness, stiff neck/back NEURO: Focal deficits
<b>Ruptured AAA</b>	Radiates, CVD risk factors, family Hx	GEN: ↓BP ABDO: Pulsatile mass

**LIMB PAIN**

<b>Arterial insufficiency</b>	Paresthesia, paralysis, Hx claudication, CVD risk factors	PVS: Pallor, cold, ↓cap refill, pulselessness, ↓sensation/strength
<b>Deep vein thrombosis</b>	Immobility, surgery, smoker, BCP, cancer, Hx DVT/PE	PVS: Edema, erythema, heat, tenderness, venous distension
<b>Septic arthritis</b>	Fever, Hx prosthesis, Hx instrumentation, sexual Hx	MSK: Edema, erythema, heat, tenderness, ↓ROM, ↓weight bearing

**ABDOMINAL PAIN**

<b>Acute MI</b>	Chest pressure, radiates, dyspnea, nausea, diaphoresis, CVD risk factors	GEN: Pallor, diaphoresis CVS: Murmur, peripheral edema
<b>Aortic dissection</b>	Tearing pain, radiates, dyspnea, paresthesia, CVD risk factors	CVS: ↑BP, asymmetric BP, murmur PVS: Limb ischemia, asymmetric pulses
<b>Appendicitis</b>	Colicky central pain → sharp RLQ pain, nausea, anorexia, fever	ABDO: ↓gut sounds, rebound, McBurney's point, Rovsing's sign, cough/bump sign
<b>Bowel obstruction, Volvulus</b>	Diffuse crampy pain, constipation, nausea, vomiting, fever, Hx surgery	ABDO: Distended, high pitch or ↓gut sounds, ↑percussion, localized tenderness, rebound
<b>Cholangitis, Cholecystitis</b>	Hx gallstones, Hx bile duct stones, nausea	GEN: Jaundice, fever, ↓BP ABDO: RUQ tender, Murphy's sign
<b>Ectopic pregnancy</b>	Crampy pain, sexual Hx, LMP, vaginal bleeding, Hx tubal abnormality	ABDO: Tender, rebound, cough/bump sign GYN: Adnexal mass
<b>Ischemic bowel</b>	Diffuse crampy pain, pain > findings, NVD, hematochezia, CVD risk factors	GEN: ↓BP ABDO: Diffusely tender, blood per rectum
<b>Pancreatitis</b>	Epigastric pain, radiates, worse with meals, nausea, Hx EtOH or gallstones	GEN: Jaundice, fever, ↓BP ABDO: Grey-Turner's sign, diffusely tender
<b>Perforated viscus, Liver/spleen injury</b>	Hx trauma, Hx instrumentation	GEN: ↓BP ABDO: Distended, tender, cough/bump sign
<b>Ruptured AAA</b>	Radiates, CVD risk factors, family Hx	GEN: ↓BP ABDO: Pulsatile mass
<b>Testicular torsion</b>	Scrotal pain, acute onset, nausea	URO: Tender, swollen, elevated testicle; absent cremasteric reflex

**HEADACHE**

<b>Carbon monoxide</b>	Dyspnea, nausea, flushing, fatigue, multiple patients from same building	NEURO: ↓LOC, papilledema
<b>Glaucoma</b>	Tearing, photophobia, vision change, Hx glaucoma, Hx steroids	NEURO: Red eye, dilated pupil, cloudy cornea, swinging light test (RAPD)
<b>Hypertensive emergency</b>	Chest pain, dyspnea, vision change, weakness, paresthesia	CVS: ↑BP, S3/S4, murmur RESP: Wheeze, crackles NEURO: ↓LOC, papilledema
<b>Meningitis, Encephalitis</b>	Fever, stiff neck, nausea	GEN: Stiff neck, petechial rash NEURO: ↓LOC, focal deficits, papilledema
<b>Preeclampsia</b>	Chest pain, dyspnea, vision Δ, weight gain, nausea, pregnant or < 1 month postpartum	GEN: ↑BP, facial/hand edema NEURO: ↓LOC, hyperreflexia
<b>Subarachnoid hemorrhage</b>	Thunderclap, stiff neck, nausea	GEN: Stiff neck NEURO: ↓LOC, focal deficits, papilledema
<b>Subdural, Epidural</b>	Hx head trauma, diplopia	NEURO: ↓LOC, focal deficits, dilated pupil
<b>Temporal arteritis</b>	Scalp tender, myalgias, jaw claudication, vision change, weight loss	GEN: Low-grade fever PVS: Scalp erythema

**RED FLAGS****Abdominal Pain**

- Abdominal mass
- Anemia
- Blood in vomit or stool
- Constitutional symptoms
- Dysphagia
- Family history of cancer
- Prolonged vomiting

**Back Pain**

- Bowel/bladder symptoms
- Constitutional symptoms
- Focal neuro deficits
- IV drug use (i.e. MRSA)
- Pain at rest/sleep
- Trauma + Age > 50

**Headache**

- Fever
- Focal neuro deficits
- Headache on awakening
- Jaw claudication
- Neck stiffness
- New headache + Age > 50
- Scalp tenderness
- Seizure
- Thunderclap headache
- Worse on exertion
